MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

I don't know if this has ever happened to you: to look for a key that is in your hand, to search for a cellphone that is on the table in front of you, to forget the name of a person in front of you while you are familiar with them... Is that a sign that in the moment this happens to someone, the person is not really focused? Maybe. What should the person do when this happens? Would taking time to "restart" be helpful? Maybe.

Sometimes we need to "pause" and "restart", especially when we believe that we need to get back to some order in our life or when we believe that things have turned into a routine in our spiritual journey.

That is why God is offering to us this Advent season, to pause and to connect more with Him. He is providing an opportunity to foresee the Joy and Consolation that the Divine Infant is to bring us soon.

"Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved" says the psalm, "...then we will never turn back from you; give us life, and we will call on your name." This prayer may be our cry today as we begin this Advent season and journey. Maybe we have been through a lot this year, our hope has been tested; our faith has not been nourished according to our desire. Yet we keep trusting in God's power to restore us, to protect us, to strengthen us and to walk with us on our life journey.

This season comes also with a call to be and to remain AWAKE. Advent season prepares us for Christmas. It is an invitation to open our hearts so that Jesus may visit us and stay with us. It is and invitation to watch and pray; to nourish hope, to nourish dreams of a better future. During this Advent season, let us take time to pray, to meditate and to seek the HOPE, FAITH, JOY and PEACE that we find only in Christ our Lord. Let us ask ourselves how and for whom we spend our lives.

Dear Lord Jesus, at times we feel so weary and tired as we seek to carry out our duties and tasks for each day. For this Advent season, help us, Lord, to step aside from the business of the day and to spend time simply waiting upon you. By doing so, we hope to renew our strength.

Lord, too often we try to do things on our own strength and only when we grow weary does it occur to us to take steps to consciously abide in you and to cast all our cares upon you. For this Advent season, teach us, O Lord, to truly abide in you, moment by moment, and to learn to wait for you as our first option, rather than as a last resort.

And as we wait on you, Lord, help us to cast all our burdens on you and to be a consolation for those who are burdened.
