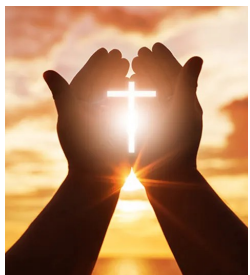

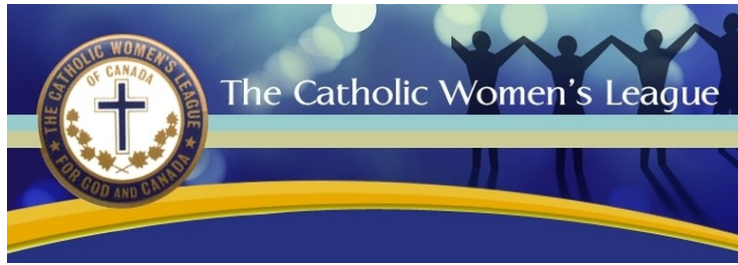

WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

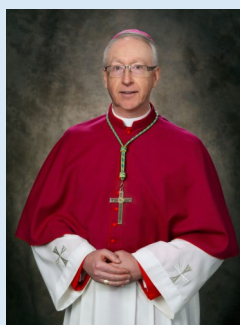
FEBRUARY-11
